Despite his protestations at the AGM Ted Hayter was re- elected Membership Secretary (after receiving a record number of subs in 1974/75 -ie. 150 - he could hardly refuse!) and he'll be happy to receive this years sub from you at 3,Downs Ave., Chislehurst,Kent. You'll also find a Bankers Order form in this issue and we would ask you to consider completing one of these since it saves both you and the Association money each year in reminders,cheques and postage.

Finally as this issue sees the start of a new era may I ask you to remember that we do like to hear your comments on Coxan and the Association so do take the opportunity to make your views known in Coxan.

The annual last minute scurry to find next years Chairman having produced no new faces (it seems that the wish to perform the function as far as Committee members is concerned is in inverse proportion to the number of years service! -perhaps its just that the longer they serve the more wily they become) I was nominated for this job despite my own misgivings as to geographical location and the somewhat dubious sense of one person being both Chairman and Editor - speaking with one voice may come too easy - hence my appeal as Editor for your views.

My appeal as Chairman is for your support especially in acheiving a target that I'd like to set this year - the target of raising our subscribing membership to 200. In 1974/75 we reached 150 - it only requires 50 of them to put us in contact - or back in contact - with 1 member of O.B. each and we're there. Alternatively this could mean the Membership Secretary trying to find 50 new members on his own. But thats not the idea at all - the raison d'etre of the target is to try and improve the contact between the members of the Association - the more members we have the more contacts we have and incidentally the more funds available to run functions which themselves may become more viable by having a greater number of possible customers!

The AGM itself proves that this target is not unattainable - the Meeting was attended by a large number of members (much larger indeed that in many recent years) and it was heartening to see so many younger members. It was also encouraging to see those same younger members arguing against allowing non-sub-paying members to play for the Football section. This is an old chestnut and despite the considerable increase in the numbers who do pay there are still those who use the facilities provided for the Section without helping defray the cost. (The match fee and section sub covers only the facilities provided by the Section). Perhaps those footballers who do pay could bring pressure to bear on those who don't to avoid the imposition of a non-pay non-play rule.

The Minutes of the A G M and the Accounts presented to it are included in this issue of Coxan. Perhaps one omission which should be corrected is the thanks of the Association and particularly the playing members of the Association, to Mick Powell who has run the 100 Club so successfully over the last year and helped raise over £500 for the Ground Fund. Our use of Norbury although curtailed seems to be safe for at least a further season but nevertheless the funds being raised by events such as the 100 Club are certain to be needed in the middle future. Needless to say if any member knows of an underused sports ground with a Clubhouse within reasonable distance of South London perhaps they could contact the Association!

- 75/1 PRESENT T Ennis (Chairman), D M Martin (Vice Chairman), P T O'Connor (Secretary)
A J Morrish (Treasurer), E Hayter (Membership Secretary), 7 Committee Members
and 14 Members.
- 75/2 The De Profundis and a minutes silence was observed for the dead.
- 75/3 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE came from Messrs Quinn, Roskowski, Casserly and Larkin.
- 75/4 MINUTES of the previous meeting were taken as read.
- 75/5 MATTERS ARISING. It was asked if a statement could be made on progress in finding
a new ground to replace Norbury. In reply, it was thought that recent editions of
COXAN gave the latest information the situation.
- 75/6 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT. I am delighted to report that the past 12 months have seen the
Association progress from strength to strength. There have been minor disappointments
- but these have been mainly financial.
Membership is running at record levels and subscriptions for the coming year are
already well up on anything we have experienced in the past.
The Annual Mass was once again poorly attended and I would ask you all to bear
in mind the date of the Mass this year, 9 November, and to attend in droves
bringing your wives, friends and relations. There is no charge for coffee and
biscuits which will be available afterwards. With just a few more members present
we should be able to fill to capacity the front bench of the Chapel!
The car rally was enjoyed by all who took part and there was an extremely good
turn out for the Annual Dinner. Sadly, both events resulted in a further financial
burden for the Association.
Your Committee, in its wisdom, decided that there was no urgent need to change
the name of the Association while there were still boys at the college who were
taught by the Xaverian Brothers. This situation will of course have to be re-
viewed in the not too distant future. All boys leaving the new Clapham College
will be eligible to join the Association.
The 100 Club has made a major contribution to the Ground Fund. The size of the
Fund to date is extremely encouraging. However, there is no room for complacency
and even greater efforts are required if this project is to be brought to fruition.
There is a continuing need for young members of the Association to serve on the
Committee. Those elected last year have made their mark and have done sterling
work on your behalf.
In conclusion, I would like to thank the Committee for their efforts over the
past year and I am convinced that the new Chairman can look forward to the
same support that I have enjoyed during my term of office.
- 75/7 TREASURER'S REPORT The Treasurer's Report was distributed at the Meeting. Mr McGuire
asked why there had been a loss on the dinner/dance. In reply, the Treasurer said
that there were 3 reasons :-
a. the menu was more elaborate than had originally been planned for
b. the cost of the tickets for guests
c. failure to recover money for tickets, mostly from football club members.
The Meeting felt that other members of the football section should exert pressure
on their erring comrades to pay up.
- 75/8 On the accounts themselves, it was mooted that the depreciation on the Clubhouse
of £25 was not realistic. The Treasurer agreed but explained that the remaining
life was difficult to assess and the Meeting decided to leave the figure at £25
for the future.

(NOTE : These Minutes have yet to be approved)

75/9 The Treasurer proposed that the subscriptions go up from £1.00 to £2.00 for members, 63p to £1.00 for junior members and £13.65 to £25 for life membership. The position had now been reached where expenditure was beginning to exceed income - with the school now split on two sites it was expected that a major source of income, the Christmas Draw profit, would be down on last year - additional funds were therefore needed for 1976. The Meeting accepted the Treasurer's proposal and together with the report, it was carried nemine contradicente.

75/12 ELECTION OF AUDITORS. Having signified their willingness to stand, D Mulvihill and J Rayer were accepted as Auditors.

75/13 ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

a. R James asked whether the Old Boy's would be able to acquire the temporary dinner centre at the College for use as a clubhouse, when the school had no further use for it. The Chairman said that the subject had already been raised in Committee but that the Headmaster of Clapham would be using the structure for school activities.

b. Mr James said that when the new buildings were completed, the school would be holding a staff sports evening to which the Old Boy's were invited. Details will be published in COXAN in due course.


c. Mr Sanders said that the new Headmaster of Clapham, Mr Gleeson, had asked that his best wishes be passed on to the Association and that every opportunity would be given to the Old Boy's to use the College facilities for its activities.

Mr Gleeson also expressed the desire that old pupils of St Gerard's School be able to join the Association, perhaps as honorary members. The Chairman said that he welcomed these remarks and that the Committee would look favourably on Mr Gleeson's request.

d. R Murphy suggested that the Association be promoted more extensively in the senior half of the school. It was important that the activities and traditions of the Association be presented before people leave the college, particularly the pupils from St Gerard's. P Dipple thought that a drive should be held with the 1st form on the lines of those given by Br. Christopher in the past. The Meeting instructed the Committee to bring the Association to the notice of the school more effectively.


e. A proposal by R James to add the word "former" to the title of COXA so as to reflect the changed status of the school was not viewed with favour by the Meeting. A J Morrish said that whilst the bulk of the membership had been taught by Xaverian Brothers, the title of the Association was appropriate. Change in the name of the Association may be needed in the future but right now it was premature
