Peter Keen writes:—"Your request, for WWII memories will possibly result in a deluge of interest, so I will try and be as brief as possible. Although I was never officially evacuated, my brother **Roy [1947/1952]** spent 1939 to early 1944 commuting from London to relatives and family friends in Wilts I was at St Georges Cathedral School and passed the "11 Plus" and my parents opted for Clapham College. My older cousin **John A Keen** was already a pupil at the College and my friends **Bernard Chammel** and **Gerald Lee** were amongst a large contingent of St George's Boys who started in September 1945. My most vivid War Memory was when Gerald and I were walking from my home, just off the Kennington Road, to his, in Lambeth Walk, when we were involved with what was one of the last V1 bombs to fall on South London. The Air Raid Alarm sounded, we were not over-concerned, as by this time, it normally meant a false alarm. But then we actually heard the V1; we were ushered into the deep entrance of a HGV Depot and not long after heard, and felt, the bomb exploding. It had hit the yard where most of the market stalls for Lambeth Walk Street Market were stored; this area had already been laid to waste by earlier bombing. We however, shared a more tragic loss, a classmate of ours, who we often walked home with, was killed when a V2 struck the Victorian mansions opposite the wreckage of Lambeth Baths. Had he lived, he would have joined us at Clapham College. Later in life I took a degree in History, with an emphasis on London and the Blitz. Hope this has been of interest" **Peter Keen [Clapham College 1945]**
